

What is a Prescription Drug Anyway?

- A medication intended to be taken under a doctor's directions and supervision
- If taken inappropriately, these medications can be dangerous









What About Over-the-Counter (OTC) Drugs?

- A medication obtained without a prescription that can be taken safely by the general population by following the directions on the package
- If taken inappropriately, some of the OTC medications can be dangerous and







Commonly Abused Products

- Painkillers
 - OxyContin® (oxycodone)
 - Lortab® (hydrocodone)
- Sedatives
 - Xanax® (alprazolam)
 - Valium® (diazepam)
- Stimulants
 - Adderall® (amphetamine salts)
 - Ritalin® (methylphenidate)
- Over-the-Counter Cough Medicines
 - Dextromethorphan (DXM)
 - Nyquil®











How are people getting them?

 70% of 12th graders in 2011 said that prescription drugs were given to them by or stolen from a friend or relative and that they did not even pay for it!







Everyone Else is Doing it



Not Even Close!

• In 2010, only 2.7% of the population, 12 years of age or older, were current nonmedical users of drugs


 Only 6.2% of 12-17 year olds used a prescription painkiller for nonmedical reasons in the past year





But Prescription Drugs are Safe, right?

- Actually...
- 1 million emergency room visits in 2009 were due to prescription drug abuse
- More than half of those emergency room visits involved multiple prescription drugs







Why are Prescriptions Dangerous?

- If you are using a drug which is not for you, the drug can work much differently in your body than for the person for whom it was prescribed
- The wrong prescription, at the wrong dose, for the wrong person, can be the same as taking a poison!







So When Should You Use a Prescription?

Prescription drugs are considered safe <u>if</u>
given to you by a Doctor <u>and</u> used in the
proper way your Doctor or Pharmacist tells
you to take them

• It is not safe to use prescription drugs that are not given directly to you hometown clinic Jato Day, State Control of Processing Processing

Not safe to use your parents' medications

- Or your siblings
- Or your friends







What is Addiction?

- Mental and physical dependence on a drug or other substance
 - Cravings
 - Withdrawal
 - Wanting to continue to use a drug even though you know its wrong or bad things can happen to you







What Can Happen if you Become Addicted?

- Signs of addiction include signs of withdrawal such as:
 - Headaches
 - Nausea
 - Vomiting
 - Hot/cold spells
 - Extreme craving
 - Various other symptoms

- It only takes one time
- Having an addiction to prescription medications can lead to a life of pain and suffering
- It can also lead to death...









How to Knockout Your Addiction

- Surround yourself with people who care about you
- Don't put yourself in situations where you will be tested
- Get help
 - Don't be ashamed
 - Addiction is powerful and a difficult illness to overcomeso don't go at it alone







Reasons to Get Help

- You are addicted to a drug
- You suspect a friend is using drugs.
 - Not "tattle-telling"
 - By getting help, you are being a good friend
- You are thinking about using drugs
- Someone has offered you drugs
- Problems with drugs at home
